The masterclasses are a Home Building Skills Partnership initiative, developed with NHBC and the Association of Brickwork Contractors (ABC) in conjunction with the industry, and funded by CITB.

The sessions are delivered by NHBC and designed to provide practical skills and knowledge on the most common brickwork issues

found by inspection teams and how to improve quality and good practice onsite. The course content covers areas such as cavity wall construction, sound insulation and much more. Free Mental Health Awareness Training for SMEs and the Supply Chain

HBF has been working with the Lighthouse Club Construction Industry charity to offer free mental health awareness training for those working in SMEs and the supply chain. SME workers make up 98% of the construction industry but many do not have access to company mental health support or employee assistance programmes. In addition, over 70% of employees working in the industry do not recognise the early signs of mental health problems and more needs to be done to help those employed in smaller businesses get the support they need. The Lighthouse Club's training course will provide information on the signs to look out for and how to start a conversation with someone who may be struggling. It will also provide advice and guidance on how to look after your own mental health and confidential support available. Courses will be held throughout the year with the first to take place online on Tuesday 8th March virtually. 
Brickwork Traineeship Standard Scales Up

The brickwork traineeship standard pilot, developed by HBF, CITB, ESFA, AoC and the British Association of Construction Heads is to set to be scaled up with traineeships in carpentry and joinery, drylining, and painting and decorating being developed. The brickwork traineeship standard pilot took place at Hartlepool College of Further Education and was created to provide vital on-the-job experience to tackle the skills shortage across the sector whilst reducing the number of full-time construction students that did not enter the industry. Since the brickwork pilot took place, 9 of the 14 trainees have gone on to apprenticeships within the sector and it is hoped the new traineeships will continue to help young people into employment and apprenticeships with a target to reach 8,000 learners by 2025. Skills Partnership visit new Training Hub

Members of the Skills Partnerships Skills & Supply Chain Group met up to tour around the new NHBC Training Hub. The Training Hub, based in Tamworth, has been built in partnership with Redrow Homes and Tamworth Council with input from industry



working groups. It will provide bricklaying apprentices with a realistic working environment and give young people the chance to build substantial structures without being on a live building site. The training hub will support more than 100 apprentices whilst addressing some of the vital skills gap the industry is experiencing.

Roger Morton, Chair of the HBF Skills and Supply Chain Group and Group Change Director at Vistry Group, said, *"It was a great opportunity* for me and the group to visit the training hub and understand more about how trainees will be learning in a realistic working environment. Many new entrants do not get enough experience to put their learning into practice before they begin work at a development. However, this new training hub will allow them to get the practical skills and experience they need to meet the needs of a real working site." Apprentices will work across an 18-month programme focussing on

the key skills needed in house building.

Brick-laying robot gets approval from NHBC

The Automatic Brick Laying Robot (ABLR) has received the 'NHBC Accepts' accreditation which means it can now be used in the construction of new homes covered by all NHBC warranty products subject to design and installation. The robot, created by Construction Automation, can build external walls, lay bricks, blocks and mortar, while running on a track around the foundations of a building. It is hoped the new ABLR will help to increase

on-site productivity, improve health and safety and close the skills shortage gap in the industry. It will also help the industry increase its integration of Modern Methods of Construction (MMC) in the delivery of new homes.
