



FE Leavers into Home Building:



- Due to the restrictions brought on by COVID-19 Pathway CTM are delivering a revised offer to the 161 students who are currently signed up to the programme which includes increased student mentorship, on line employability webinar classes, more use of social media, Instagram live, digital training.
- More employers are joining webinars and creating content such as virtual tours of home building sites and are bringing subcontractors and apprentices into webinars to answer questions that would otherwise have been experienced during work experience.
- Hubs are being created to carry out virtual interview practice.



Women into Home Building:



- 33 women completed the first two training programmes, in north London and Birmingham respectively, before the lockdown was introduced.
- Many have been successful in being employed, or have received job/apprenticeship offers.
- All women continue to receive ongoing support from WiC, including mentorship calls, advice & guidance and employment connections.
- Women into Construction (WiC) have also developed an active social media support network for all the candidates and are developing & testing online registration & information webinars to continue to engage women.

Service Leavers (12m+) into Home Building:

- Hopkins Homes in conjunction with Fortis have prepared a pathway programme that is ready to launch for a pilot group of 25 ex-military personnel. The attract campaign and scheduling of the sessions are due to be re-visited post covid and funding restrictions.



NEETs into Home Building:

- Futures for You were due to start their programme for 40 individuals in April, all the material and communication channels are ready to go when restrictions have been lifted.
