MEETING NOTES

1. Welcome and Introductions

PH opened the meeting and welcomed everyone. Apologies were accepted from those listed above. The group were asked to introduce themselves.

2. Notes of previous meeting including Action Log update

Referring to 5b 'Soft Landing Systems (SLS)' in previous meeting notes RC said what was noted was incorrect on PAS 59, the testing isn't the issue it's the science behind it that's the issue. Research of academic information is needed, research will be done in two phases over the next years. Is there any evidence that shows injuries are being caused?

Similarly RC indicated that HSE were awaiting design related information in order that they could finalise comments on final draft of Guide to scaffold specification. VC to liaise with RC.

3. Feedback from Health and Safety focus group meeting on 11th December

DM explained the idea behind creating a H&S Focus group, which was to review the past year, create a meeting format for 2016 and discuss possible initiatives for 2016.

It will become the committee chair's responsibility to send all the latest documents through to RS to be uploaded. 4. Dust in Construction latest – Dave Hickman/Ed Woods

DH not present but updated DM prior to meeting – DH has arranged for Chris Lucas from the HSE to present the findings of the HSL investigations into exposures, to the Health Working Group and 'survey' volunteers on the 12th February at Miller offices. Chris is going to try and get manufacturers to attend. DH intends to issue a briefing note/update to the group after this and recommendations on how we should proceed with our initiative on dust.

5. Statistics update (Reportable Injuries and Dangerous Occurrences/Fire Incidents/Fee for Intervention) including annual report update and update on collection of data

In future it will be indicated if a 0 result is for a company that is inactive (doesn't supply data) or 0 is their result; the company(s) who haven't supplied data will be circled, there will be a key on the charts to show what the circle means, so that it is clear for everyone.

MSC are interested in marketing the H&S annual report and comparing house building against other industries. There was discussion about formatting the H&S report annual report to make it more high level.

HBF to create a forum and set up learning events for members so they can share good/bad experiences with near misses, with the aim that members will learn from them.

It was discussed that sub groups should create briefs on what they want to achieve within the group and dates they plan to achieve the goals. When creating these briefs the group shall share what they think they should be focusing on, so the group stay focused and on track.
