MEETING NOTES

1. Welcome and Introductions

PH opened the meeting and welcomed everyone. Apologies were accepted from those listed above. The group were asked to introduce themselves.

2. Notes of previous meeting including Action Log update

Meeting notes accepted.

HSE (RC) await final calculations from the HBF in order that HBF Template for a Scaffold Specification review can be concluded.- VC to forward revised details.

Action: VC

Following discussions over the Scaffold specification document, it was confirmed that when published it is to be clearly identified as guidance only. The main purpose and objective was to provide members with guidance on some of the key items that could be included in their respective scaffolding specifications and that members can adopt in its entirety, or can use it as the basis of a higher company standard as individual members see fit.

3. Sentencing Guidelines – Steffan Groch

SG attended the meeting to update the group on Sentencing Guidelines.

A presentation on 'New Sentencing Guidelines' Fine Review' from Steffan Groch was distributed to the committee.

It was made clear that with the implementation of these guidelines there is an expectation that million pound fines will become common place for health and safety offences. The nature of Construction as a high risk sector, in conjunction with the turnover of many of the member organizations, indicates that the most significant fines would be applied in the sentencing process.

4. Dust in Construction latest – Dave Hickman

DH gave a presentation on 'HSE wood dust exposure survey' which has been sent out the group.

Miller Homes assessment of exposure to wood dust report has also been circulated to the group.

An illustration the survey picked up dry sweeping was still common practice even when vacuum tools and equipment where available on site.

Indicative Task Results:

Dry sweeping: Min: 12 minutes using extraction 3.8 mg/m³ total dust & 2.3 mg/m³ (TWA) wood dust Max: 25 minutes dry sweeping 27.6 mg/m³ total dust & 18.6 mg/m³ (TWA) wood dust This would indicate that as an activity a focus on moving the sector away from dry sweeping would be very beneficial in improving the health hazard exposures for many of our personnel.

The use of a TWA(Time Weighted Average) masks different exposures between tasks and potential high peaks.

Whilst the correct RPE(Respiratory protective equipment) is on site often operatives have been face fit tested it is still worn incorrectly in many instances.

Work with Health in Construction Leadership Group to highlight the safety side issues and make sure Housebuilders are more involved in the group. Next forum 21st January 2017.

DH tabled details of vacuum equipment manufactured by V-TÜF. V-TÜF are providing HBF members with 50% off the UK RRP prices. The V-TUF DUSTEX - 50% HBF DEAL Hybrid info paper has been distributed to the committee.

5. Occupational Health & Wellbeing questionnaire results

MS produced a survey, which some members contributed too, this survey was distributed to the committee. The results of the survey show wellbeing is generally poorly addressed. However, it was noted that a clear definition of "wellbeing" may be useful

A few member companies have formed a sub group on wellbeing, if you wish to join this sub group or find out more information about it please contact MS <u>michelle.shani@cpplc.com</u>. This is a sub group of our Health in group.

The group will provide an update at next meeting together with both terms of reference and an outline program of activity for the sub group..

A) Statistics update (Reportable Injuries and Dangerous Occurrences/Fire Incidents/Fee for Intervention) including annual report update an update on collection of data & injury comparison with other industries

Q4 results being collated, once all results have be submitted, the annual written report for 2015-16 will be produced.

The HBF's Health and Safety Focus Group have suggested that we should be looking to highlight the good work that the industry does in relation to Health and Safety on site. Therefore HBF are looking at creating a booklet that will take school children (but also others that may read the content) on a journey through a site, with each step explained as to what H&S procedures employees have to go through and why. That will then be complemented with case studies of two or three outstanding H&S employees from within the industry. This can create a positive image for the sector and also help with the current skills issues we are facing.

B) Data collection

DM told the group that there will be a meeting on the 26th May at HBF which will involve volunteers from both H&S Committee and the Qualifying the Workforce group, to discuss both sets of figures the HBF produce.

Charter Action plan and action log are now combined to make sure there is no duplication.

d. CDM sub-group

CONIAC has established a working group to collect and collate case studies and illustrations of good practice under CDM 2015.
