HBF determined three key activities to help steer the home building industry through the crisis:

- Understanding the views of members through weekly phone calls
- Relaying these concerns to Government and other key stakeholders including the Construction Leadership Council
- Keeping the industry updated on the latest developments through our new communications channels, the Daily Coronavirus Briefing and the dedicated coronavirus web page on the HBF website



The initial response of the home building industry

Government permitted construction activity to continue during lockdown

The home building industry's top priority was protecting the health and safety of its workforce, supply chains and the local communities in which it builds

Most home building stopped due to: 1) The need to establish new ways of working safely in line with PHE and Government guidance 2) The difficulties posed by the closure of much of the supply chain and sales market 3) Public perception

At the top of industry's priority list was ensuring a **safe** return to site as soon as practically possible



A safe and gradual return to site

- The home building industry has been undertaking a gradual and phased return to work
- This has been supported by the launch of the HBF/MHCLG Charter for Safe Working Practice in May
- Its purpose is to ensure development is carried out safely and in accordance with Government and PHE guidelines
- In conjunction with members, we have also produced a guidance document for industry on how to reopen sales offices safely

The role of home building...

...in the economic recovery

Attentions are turning to the recovery phase but it is too soon to tell how the industry will fare in the coming months

The industry supported 800,000 jobs and £42bn of economic activity in 2018-19

A range of measures could be introduced to help the industry to deliver on its potential



Enabling home builders to support the economic recovery

These measures include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Extending the current Help to Buy scheme
- Boosting the second hand market
- Support for retirement housing
- Permitting extant planning permissions to be extended
- Improving the availability and terms of SME finance
- Homes England acquiring stock for affordable housing

We are raising these issues with Government directly and through the Construction Leadership Council (CLC) – HBF is leading the CLC's Housing Group, one of four industry groups tasked with looking at the recovery of the construction sector
